## **Child Safety Policy**

The Two Harbors Public Library is dedicated to providing a welcoming and safe environment for patrons of all ages. Sharing this environment with other people requires that everyone act in a respectful manner towards staff and other patrons and that everyone follow the Library's Policies.

The safety of children left alone in a library building is a serious concern of the library staff. The responsibility for the safety and behavior of children in the library rests with the parent/caregiver and not with the library staff. Library staff cannot be responsible for children who are unattended or demonstrating inappropriate behavior.

## Children under the age of 8

- Children under the age of 8 must have a legal guardian/caregiver in the immediate vicinity of and in visual contact with the child. The assigned caregiver, if other than a legal guardian, must be an adult or responsible teenager of the age 13 or above and must carry emergency contact information.
- If a child in this age group is found unattended, library staff will attempt to locate the guardian/caregiver in the library and inform him/her of the rules. If the guardian/caregiver cannot be found, or if the Library is closing, the non-emergency law enforcement will be called for assistance.

## Children age 8 and older

- Children age 8 and older may use the library on their own. However, legal guardians are still responsible for the actions and the well-being of their children.
- Children exhibiting inappropriate behavior may be asked to leave the library. If a child in this age group is not able to leave the library without an adult, they should not be in the library alone. This is a particular concern in inclement weather and after dark.
- All children should have the telephone number of someone who can assist them in an emergency.
- For the safety of a child left unattended in the library at closing, appropriate nonemergency law enforcement authorities will be contacted to take custody of the child. Staff will wait 15 minutes after closing before this measure is taken.
